We have been developing our independence skills in eating, toileting, and moving to different areas in school (inside and out) with less adult support.

This term, Banana class have enjoyed multi-sensory lessons and stories where they have worked on building their tolerance of exploring resources using various senses. Incorporation of light sources to capture their attention during such lessons has enabled the children to maintain engagement and work on their visual tracking. They have enjoyed a total communication environment where we use a range of communication methods, such as, Makaton, on body signing, switch communication etc, to ensure each child has meaningful interactions.

Our pupils have amazed us with their switch activation skills this term. They are working towards using switches as a means of key word communication and choice making. They have worked hard to utilise the switches and have become comfortable with the various effects the different devices produce. We are all excited to develop on these skills in the spring term.

They have been working hard on their literacy and numeracy skills in class. Strawberry Class










Orange Class

School Council











A Winter Recipe



- · 275g plain flour
- · 100g unsalted butter, softened
- 100g caster sugar
- 1 medium egg, lightly beaten
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- To decorate:
- 400g icing sugar
- 3-4 tbsp water
- · 1 small tube black icing
- · Brightly coloured mini candy coated chocolates

Equipment:

- · Oven
- · Baking tray
- Baking parchment
- · 2 large bowls
- · Wooden spoon
- · Rolling pin · Round biscuit cutters

- 1. Preheat your oven to 190°C/gas mark 5 and line a baking tray with some baking parchment.
- 2. Using the wooden spoon, cream the butter and sugar together until smooth.
- 3. Beat in the egg and vanilla extract, a little at a time.
- 4. Slowly, stir in the flour until the mixture forms a dough.
- 5. Roll the dough out on a floured surface until it is about 1cm thick.
- 6. Use your biscuit cutters to cut out your biscuit shapes. Re-roll the remaining dough and repeat this step until you have used all the dough up.
- 7. Bake for 8-10 minutes or until pale golden-brown.
- 8. Leave to cool on a wire rack.
- 9. Mix the icing sugar with enough water to form a smooth paste.
- 10. Carefully, spread the icing over each biscuit and leave to harden.
- 11. Using the black icing tube, pipe two thin, curved lines across each biscuit.
- 12. Decorate with the coloured mini candy-coated chocolates so they stick along the black icing lines.
- 13. Leave to set and enjoy!
